The International Space Weather Initiative (ISWI) promotes space weather science via deployment of instruments that collect data, workshops to analyze data from ground- and space-based instruments, and advanced space science schools to train young scientists and graduate students. The ISWI workshops are conducted in collaboration with the United Nations Office of Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA). The next workshop will be hosted by the Space Physics Laboratory, Vikram Sarabhai Space Center, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, India during November 2-6, 2020. The goal of the workshop is to address open questions in space weather science using ground- and space-based data. Analysis of data from ISWI instruments are particularly encouraged.
